LECTURE TITLE: “Implant Esthetics and the Importance of Provisionalisation and Abutment Choice and Design : Concentrating on Enhancing Results.?”

LECTURE SYNOPSIS:

High-end implant esthetics requires precise steps from diagnosis through to the restorative phase. These steps are not exclusive of each other. They are deliberate and require a clear understanding of what is possible and the skill required to carry out each procedure. Each small advancement will help in the initial and long term stability of the treatment. Arguably provisionalisation and abutment selection are two of the most important stages in the blueprint. This presentation will focus specifically on these two components of treatment, illustrating how these steps are as closely related to the surgical phase as they are to the final restoration.
