CHARLES L. ZEIGLER, DDS

PRESIDENT, AACB 1975-1976

Dr. Zeigler graduated from Marquette University in 1951. He joined the faculty of his school in 1952 as an instructor in Pedodontics for 5 years and later in the Department of Crown and Bridge, of which he became Chairman, and an Assistant Professor of Oral Diagnosis in 1964. He was President of the OKU Chapter in 1968.

Charles was active with the Greater Milwaukee Dental Association and served on the Board of Directors from 1959 - 1964. He filled other offices for the Association and passed through the chairs becoming President in 1970. He also served on many committees for that Association. He served as a Delegate to the Wisconsin State Dental Society, serving perpetually from 1955 - 1976. He served on many other committees during the years becoming President of the Wisconsin Dental Association 1981-1982.

Dr. Zeigler was a member of the American Prosthodontic Society, Wisconsin Gnathological Society, Psi Omega, International College of Dentists, Midwest Dental Seminar, Chicago Dental Society, American Academy of Restorative Dentistry, and the Federation of Prosthodontic Organizations.

Dr. Zeigler was an essayist at various societies in the Greater Milwaukee and surrounding areas. He also published papers on the topics of occlusion and occlusal principles.

Dr. Zeigler received prestigious awards for his services to the dental profession. He received the Marquette University School of Dentistry Alumnus of the Year award in 1980 and the same year was Psi Omega Alumnus of the Year.

Charles Zeigler served on several committees for the American Academy of Crown and Bridge both before and after his Presidency. He was the President of the AAFP in 1976, succeeding Dr. John Schlick who passed away early in his term as President
