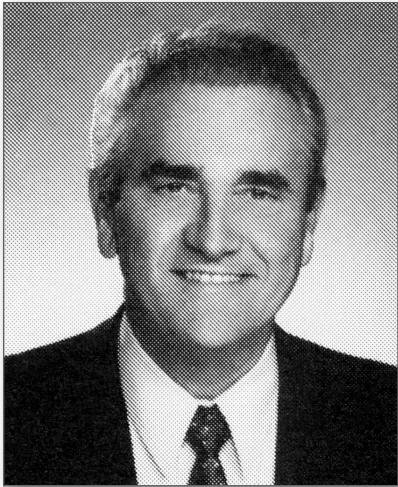

PRESIDENTIAL BIOGRAPHY



JESSE T. BULLARD DDS

PRESIDENT, AAFP 1994-1995

Dr. Jesse T. Bullard is a Professor Emeritus in the Department of Restorative Sciences at Baylor College of Dentistry. Prior to joining the faculty at Baylor, Dr. Bullard enjoyed a distinguished twenty-four year career in the U.S. Army, eleven years of which he served as an enlisted soldier. In 1957, after attaining the rank 1st Sergeant in the 82nd Airborne Division, Jesse Bullard, a Veteran of the Korean War, began dental school at the University of Tennessee in Memphis.

Following his graduation from dental school in 1960, Dr. Bullard received his prosthodontics training at Letterman General Hospital, San Francisco, California in 1967. In 1968 Dr. Bullard became a Diplomate of the American Board of Fixed Prosthodontics. After retiring from military service with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel, Dr. Bullard came to Baylor in 1970 and served as Chairman of the Department Operative Dentistry.

He developed the first residency program in Fixed Prosthodontics at Baylor College of Dentistry and served as its director until 1985. Dr. Bullard subsequently served as the first Chairman of the Department of Restorative Sciences, which encompassed the disciplines of operative dentistry, fixed and removable prosthodontics, and endodontics.

He retired to full-time private practice in 1995. He has served as president of the Federation of Prosthodontic Organizations and the American Academy of Fixed Prosthodontics and has lectured extensively in both the U.S. and abroad. As an educator and prosthodontist, Dr. Bullard has had a significant impact on the art and science of prosthodontics throughout the world.
