THE ORIGIN AND HERITAGE OF THE AMERICAN ACADEMY OF CROWN AND BRIDGE PROSTHODONTICS

The American Academy of Crown and Bridge is the leading national voice of crown and bridge prosthodontics. Its membership is composed of educators, clinical practitioners and researchers of this important discipline of dentistry.

The purpose of this organization is to achieve by mutual study and cooperation, activities reflecting a high and ethical standard of practice as well as teaching and research in the art and science of crown and bridge prosthodontics.

The Academy had its origin in 1950, in Chicago, Illinois. The three men who deserve credit for the concept and preliminary plan for the Academy were: Dr. Stanley D. Tylman, Dr. Claude R. Baker and Dr. George H. Moulton. These men of vision rallied other important leaders in the crown and bridge field to actively support their cause. Together they planned an organizational meeting that took place at the Stevens Hotel on February 5, 1951. Those present at that meeting were: Doctors Stanley D. Tylman, Arthur O. Klaffenbach, Robert P. Dressel, Alver Selberg, Charles E. Peterka, Earl A. Nelson, Claude R. Baker and George H. Moulton. Dr. Baker was chosen temporary chairman and Dr. Moulton temporary secretary.

The next meeting was at French Lick, Indiana on March 19, 1951 where the tentative Constitution and By-Laws were presented for final approval. Charter members were initiated into the Academy on February 2, 1952 in Chicago, making this the first annual meeting of the Academy of Crown and Bridge Prosthodontics. We have continued to grow and expand our national and international membership to our present total of 381.

Members of today have a proud heritage in the Academy. We continue to dedicate ourselves to the pursuit of knowledge, truth and competency in research, in teaching, and in the clinical practice of crown and bridge prosthodontics.





SYNOPSIS: The area of dental implants has been long on anecdote, short on science. Recent longitudinal clinical research in Sweden and Toronto has underscored the feasibility of a predictably safe method of osseointegrating tooth root analogues. The scientific background and clinical implications of this method will be reviewed and analyzed.

"Current Trends in Malpractice and Litigation"

SYNOPSIS: The increasing number of dental malpractice claims looms as a potential crisis for the dental profession, threatening to substantially raise the cost of providing necessary dental services. Several factors have given rise to the growth of malpractice claims, including changes in malpractice law, changes in the relationship between dentist and patient, and also a number of cases of incompetent dental work. A dentist who is informed of the type of questionable dental practices that commonly lead to malpractice claims is better equipped to avoid liability himself. In addition, the public should be informed of the impact of malpractice claims on the cost of providing dental care and also of the efforts of the dental profession to police itself. Finally, the dental profession must work towards responsible changes in the law to reduce the number of frivolous claims and excessive awards. Only if appropriate action is taken now will highquality dental care continue to be available to the public at a reasonable cost.

"Ultrathinned and Collarless Copings for Metal-Ceramic Restorations"

SYNOPSIS: Improved esthetics can be achieved with metal-ceramic crowns when ultrathinned or collarless copings are employed. These design options are frequently avoided because of the belief that such crowns may distort due to incompatibility stresses or they may fail prematurely in clinical service because of the inability to support intraoral forces. This presentation will provide a comparative analysis of the esthetic potential of these crowns and their resistance to thermal mismatch stresses and simulated intraoral stresses.

The cardinal diagnostic questions are how much compromise each factor represents and how much alteration of the existing condition is required in order to provide the desired prosthetic result.

"Planned Provisional Restorations"

SYNOPSIS: A planned provisional restoration provides the opportunity to examine and assess many considerations that are integral to the success or failure of fixed restorations. Many questions arise in treatment planning fixed restorations. Questions relating to occlusion, esthetics, phonetics, tooth mobility, retention, tooth vitality, etc. The provisional restoration can answer many of these questions providing it is adequately planned, carefully fabricated, and given an adequate clinical trial. A predictable restorative result can then be obtained by utilizing this information directly in the fabrication of the permanent restoration.

CURRICULUM VITAE: Dr. Morgan received his D.D.S. degree from the University of Alberta in 1967 and his M.S.D. degree and certificate in Fixed Prosthodontics from the University of Washington in 1977. He is an associate professor at the University of Alberta and has been active in teaching and research since 1970.
