JOHN HENRY EMMERT, DDS

PRESIDENT, AACB 1982-1983

Dr. John H. Emmert was born in Indianapolis, Indiana on July 15, 1915. He was raised and educated in Cleveland, OH. He attended Shaker Heights High School (Graduate 1935), Antioch College and Kent State University before entering Western Reserve University School of Dentistry in 1939. John received his D.D.S. from WRUSD in 1942. In 1942 he was an Instructor in Diagnosis at the school before entering the US Army Dental Corps during World War II. He was honorably discharged at the rank of Major in 1946.

Dr. Emmert returned to his alma mater first as Instructor in Crown and Bridge and then in 1949 promoted to Assistant Professor and then in 1972 Chair of Crown and Bridge. During these years he was involved in Private Practice in Cleveland, OH.

Dr. Emmert was active in the American Dental Association, Cleveland Dental Society and the American Academy of Crown and Bridge Prosthodontics. The offices he held in the AACB were Board of Censors (1952-62), Board of Directors (1962-65), and Secretary (1966-1975). He moved through the chairs of the AACB and was President in 1983.

John was highly regarded as a clinician and lecturer, being involved with the CWRU Crown and Bridge Study Club, Simulator (articulator) Study Club, Doan Study Club and many other local societies for over thirty years. He also made presentation before the Ohio State dental Association, American Equilibration Society and the AACB on fixed prosthodontics and occlusion.
