


AMERICAN ACADEMY OF FIXED PROSTHODONTICS PRESIDENTIAL BIOGRAPHY



JOHN T. GOODMAN, DDS

PRESIDENT, AAFP 2002-2003

Dr. John T. Goodman graduated from Baylor University College of Dentistry, Dallas, TX in 1968. he received the C & B award there in 1968. Upon graduation he served a 1-year rotating Dental Internship, Ireland Army Hospital, for Fort Knox, Kentucky from 1968-69. Two years later, he entered the Fixed Prosthodontic Residency, William Beaumont army Medical Center, El Paso, TX (1971-1973).

He earned Diplomate status of the American Board of Prosthodontics in 1974 and was recertified in 2005.

During John's military career (1968-1979) he served as chief, Fixed Prosthodontics, Dental Internship Program, Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri from 1973-1975 followed by service as Chief, Fixed Prosthodontics Department, General Dentistry Residency Program, Madigan Army Medical Center, Tacoma, Washington from 1975-1976. He retired from the U.S. Army in 1976. In 1989 he retired from the U.S. Air Force at the rank of Colonel.

Dr. Goodman entered the academic field at the rank of Assistant Professor at the University of Alabama, School of Dentistry in the Department of Crown and Bridge. In 1978 he was promoted to Associate Professor with tenure. He was Director of Occlusion at UASD from 1976-1979. He established a practice limited in Arlington Texas in 1980 but continued part-time as a clinical Associate professor at Baylor College of Dentistry (1980-1998) in the Department at Fixed Prosthodontics and in Graduate Prosthodontics Texas A & MHSC (1998-present (2009).

Dr. Goodman received several honors including OKU Faculty (1991), Legion of Merit USAF (1989), and a Commendation Medal from the US Army (1975). He is a member and Fellow of the ACP, and a member of the Academy of Osseointegration, ADA and local and state organizations in Texas. Dr. Goodman served on several committees of the AAFP and served as Director, 1996-1999 and President 2003.
