


AMERICAN ACADEMY OF CROWN AND BRIDGE PRESIDENTIAL BIOGRAPHY



RONALD G. GRANGER, DDS
PRESIDENT, AACB 1988-1989

Dr. Ronald G. Granger was born on September 26, 1929. He attended Columbia College of Columbia University from 1947 to 1950 where he received a B. A. degree. He attended the Columbia University School of Dental and Oral Surgery from 1950 and received his D.D.S. in 1954.

Dr. Granger entered the U. S. Navy in 1954 after dental school and had a distinguished career as a dental officer and mentor. He received a certificate in General Postgraduate Dentistry (1960-1961) and then his Graduate Training in Prosthodontics (1961-1962) resulting in a certificate from the Naval Dental School, Bethesda, MD. He became a Diplomate of the American Board of Prosthodontics in 1967. From 1969 to 1973 Ron was Head, Fixed Prosthodontic Section in the Prosthodontic Department at the Naval Graduate Dental School at Bethesda during which he trained hundreds of Navy dentists in clinical fixed prosthodontics and also gave annual continuing education refresher courses to dental officers. Dr. Granger was also a Professorial Lecturer in Oral Biology from 1971 to 1976, Graduate School of Arts and Sciences, George Washington University, Washington, D.C. Ronald was Chairman, Prosthodontic Department and Director of Graduate Prosthodontics as well as the Prosthodontic Consultant to the Residency in Comprehensive Dentistry from 1974 to 1977, also at Naval Dental Center in Bethesda. Dr. Granger retired from the Navy in September of 1980.

Dr. Granger was appointed the Director of the Advanced Program in Prosthodontic were he organized the program to achieve full accreditation by the ADA for certification and eligibility for American Board of Prosthodontics. His served in this position from 1980 until 1986 whence he retired.

Ronald gave many presentations on Prosthodontics (including metal ceramics, esthetics, and all other phases of fixed and removable prosthodontic) not only in the Navy, but also to many Associations, Dental Schools, and State and Local Dental Societies and study groups. He has also has published in journals and mentored various research project for publication and thesis projects.

His membership in professional organizations includes the ADA, AADS, American Prosthodontic Society, Northeastern Prosthodontic Society, and Greater Boston Dental Society. Ron was a Charter Fellow of the American College of Prosthodontics (1971) and was also elected to The American College of Dentists (1972). He was a member of the American Academy of Crown and Bridge Prosthodontics (now the AAFP) where he served on various committees including Secretary (1980 - 1986) and President 1988 to 1989.
