



# AMERICAN ACADEMY OF CROWN AND BRIDGE PRESIDENTIAL BIOGRAPHY



**E. EDWARD KRAUS, DDS**

**PRESIDENT, AACB 1968-1969**

*Dr. E. Edward Kraus was born in Ellsworth, Wisconsin in 1905. He lived in Cedarburg, WI for many years where he attended public school and later River Falls State Teachers (1921) before moving to Milwaukee. He had a brief career in primary education working in the Pierce County Public School System and later as Principle at the Junior High School, Washburn County, WI from 1923-24.*

*Dr. Kraus was graduated in 1928 from the Marquette University School of Dentistry (MUSD) where he taught part-time from 1930-1962, while maintaining a private practice in Milwaukee until he retired in 1973. He began at MUSD as an instructor in operative dentistry (1930). He was also credited as being the Chairman, Department of Crowns and Fixed Partial Dentures in the 1950's. He resigned in 1962.*

*His students because of his reputation as a tough taskmaster knew Dr. Kraus as "Big Ed". Students returned years after to express their appreciation for his demanding attention to detail. He also had an international reputation for his work with dentures.*

*Ed Kraus was a member of Psi Omega, OKU, and the American Society for Children, and American Academy of Plastics Dental Forum. He participated in organized dentistry as a member of the ADA, and Milwaukee County Dental Association. He was honored also a Fellow of the American College of Dentists.*

*Dr. Kraus served the American Academy of Crown and Bridge Prosthodontics (AACBP) in several capacities before becoming President in 1968-1969. He passed away in 1976 at the age of 71 with complications after a stroke.*
