PRESIDENTIAL BIOGRAPHY



PETER S. LUND, DDS, MS

PRESIDENT, AAFP 2004-2005

Dr. Peter Scott Lund was born in Minnesota in 1953. He received a B.F.A. in music from the University of Minnesota College of Liberal Arts (1971-1976), his D.D.S. from University of Minnesota School of Dentistry (UMSD 1976-1980) and an M. S. in Prosthodontics (1985-1987) from the University of Minnesota Graduate School. He earned American Board of Prosthodontics Certification, becoming a Diplomate in 1994.

Peter was in private dental practice from 1980-1987 in Minneapolis, MN and was a Clinical Instructor at the UMSD in the Department of Removable and Fixed Prosthodontics from 1982-1987.

Dr. Lund was appointed Assistant Professor (1981-1993) and then Associate Professor in 1993 at the University of Iowa SD. He then moved to the University of Illinois at Chicago (UICSD) as an Associate Professor and Co-Director of the Graduate Prosthodontic Program (1993-1997). Peter then returned to private practice limited to Prosthodontics in Minneapolis from 1997-2006.

Lund was then recruited to return to the UISD in 2007 as Associate Professor and became Director of Graduate Prosthodontics in 2008 taking over for the retiring Dennis Weir.

During his career Dr. Lund received many honors, including OKU as a student and faculty, and accomplished many things. Among these were lecturing at to local, state and national prosthodontic organizations where he presented at least 34 lectures. He also served as author and co-author for over 18 publications (JPD, IJP, JPO, over 28 abstracts for the Journal of Dental Research, and mentored and/or directed 10+ M. S. Theses. He has also served on the Editorial Review Board and as reviewer for the JP and JPD.

Starting in 1994, Peter Lund has served continuously on 13 different committees, the Board of Directors and as Webmaster for the American Academy of Fixed Prosthodontics. He passed through the chairs (2002-2005) for the AAFP culminating as President in 2004-2005.
