

AMERICAN ACADEMY OF CROWN AND BRIDGE PRESIDENTIAL BIOGRAPHY



KENNETH N. MORRISON
PRESIDENT, AACB 1973-1974

Dr. Kenneth Morrison was born on November 14, 1917 in Guelph, Ontario, Canada. He received his D.D.S. from the University of Toronto in 1943. He was in private practice in Vancouver, B.C. from 1946-48 and part-time in Seattle, WA from 1950 while he participated as an Instructor, Department of Operative Dentistry while studying for a

master's degree. He earned his M.S.D. in Restorative Dentistry in 1952 from the University of Washington School of Dentistry.

He began his full-time academic career in 1952 as an Assistant Professor, Department of Operative and Fixed Partial Dentures. In 1957 he was promoted to Associate Professor and Chairman of the Department of Fixed Partial Dentures followed by Full Professorship in 1969. From 1970 he was Chairman of the Department of Restorative Dentistry and in 1977 assumed a dual role also as Associate Dean for the School of Dentistry. During his career he served on a multitude of important committees for the School of Dentistry and for the University proper.

His honors included President of OKU, Fellow of the American College of Dentists, and Honorary member of the Canadian Academy of Restorative Dentistry. He was also a consultant to the VA Hospital Dental Service in Seattle, Madigan US Army Hospital, and a consultant for the Dental Laboratory Advisory Committee for the Seattle Community College. He served on committees for the Washington State Dental Association, Seattle District Dental Society and American Association of Dental Schools. Dr. Morrison also co-published several works in the Journal of Dental Research, Journals of Prosthetic Dentistry, Canadian Dental Association, Seattle District Dental Society, Dental Education, Dental Digest and other international papers. He has presented before the Canadian Dental Association, Chicago Dental Society, and the Canadian Academy of Restorative Dentistry

Dr. Morrison's was a member in the American College of Dentists, Academy of Gold Foil Operators, American Association of Dental Schools and the American Academy of Crown and Bridge Prosthodontics. He was on the Board of Directors of the AACB (1967-70).
