


AMERICAN ACADEMY OF FIXED PROSTHODONTICS PRESIDENTIAL BIOGRAPHY



RICHARD D. WILSON DDS, MSD
PRESIDENT, AAFP 1997-1998

Dr. Richard D. Wilson was in the private practice of general dentistry in Richmond, Virginia since his graduation from Temple University School of Dentistry in 1958. He completed 29 years on the adjunct faculty at the School of Dentistry, Virginia Commonwealth University, terminating as Clinical Professor. Dr. Wilson served two simultaneous four terms on The American Dental Association Council on Dental Education (now The Council on Dental Education and Licensure) and The Commission on Dental Accreditation, the last two years as Chair

of both.

A member of The American Academy of Restorative Dentistry, The Academy of Operative Dentistry and The American Academy of Fixed Prosthodontics, where he is a Past-President, Dr. Wilson served six years as a member of the Board of Trustees of The American Academy of Periodontology. Dr. Wilson gave over 500 lectures on restorative dentistry and esthetics in Virginia, the U.S., Canada, Asia, and Europe, including live T.V. demonstrations before The Chicago Midwinter Meeting and The Yankee Dental Congress. He is a Fellow of The American College of Dentists, a Fellow of The International college of Dentists and Served 13 years in The American dental Association House of Delegates.

Richard was past member of the Virginia Board of Health Professions and The Virginia Board of Dentistry. Dr. Wilson published in The Journal of The American Dental Association, The Journal of Periodontology, The Dental Clinics of North America, The International Journal of Periodontics and Restorative Dentistry. The Journal of the American College of Dentists and has chapters in seven different texts. He was a reviewer for The Journal of The American Dental Association and The International Journal of Periodontics and Restorative Dentistry and had served nineteen years as a Virginia's Medical/dental Malpractice Review Panel. He served as an expert for The Virginia Board of Dentistry and continues to lecture widely on the topic of dental ethics. Dr. Wilson was married and the father of five children, the youngest of whom (Elizabeth) joined him in practice.
