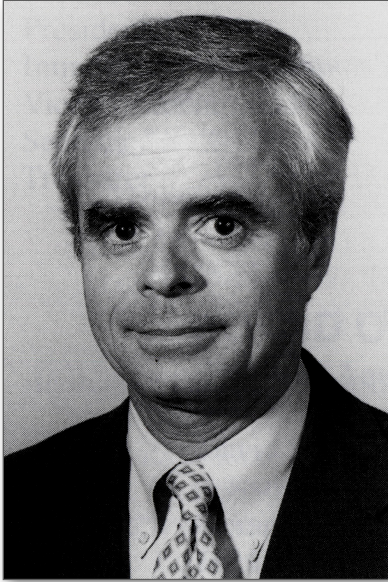

PRESIDENT, AAFP 1996-1997

Dr. Gerald J. Ziebert was born in Milwaukee, WI on June 1, 1933. He received his predoctoral preparation at Marquette University from 1950-1952 and then received his DDS from the School of Dentistry in 1956. Upon graduation he served in the U.S. Navy Dental Corp. (Rotating Internship?) from 1956-1958. In 1959 he entered full-time practice where he continued until 1971.

Dr. Ziebert earned a Certificate in Advanced Prosthodontics and an MS in 1971 from Marquette University School of Dentistry (MUSD). He became a Diplomate, American Board of Prosthodontics. In 1971, he entered full-time teaching at his alma mater. He has continued there until the present as a full-time teacher and part-time private practice in Prosthodontics since 1971.

Gerald is a member of the American College of Prosthodontists, Academy of Prosthodontics, Greater New York Academy of Prosthodontics as well as other national and local dental organizations. Dr. Ziebert was President of the Greater Milwaukee Dental Association in 1976 and also was President of the AAFP in 1997. He received the Professional Achievement Award of the Wisconsin Dental Association in 2004.

Dr. Ziebert is the inaugural recipient of the AAFP's Garver-Staffanou Award, given for outstanding graduate program directorship. has also had 24 publications and 36 abstracts to his credit and served on the Commission on Dental Accreditation for the ADA.
